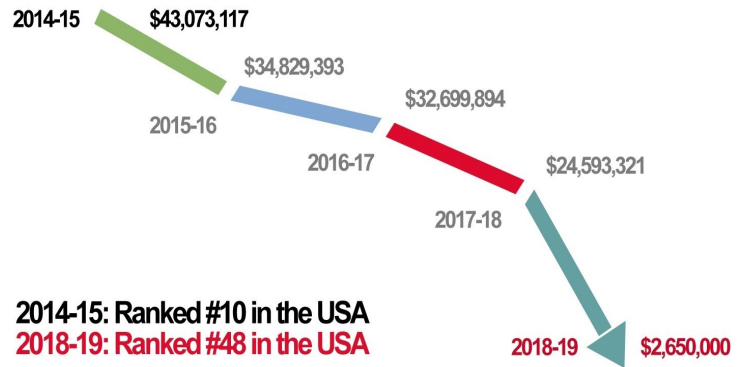

In Fiscal Year 2014-2015 when the Florida Legislature invested 100%, Florida's arts and cultural nonprofits generated \$201,165,000 back to LOCAL government treasury; \$291,176,000 back to STATE government treasury for a total of \$492,341,000 returned to government treasuries.
